One especially fascinating feature of this study is its examination of the packaged-foods industry and the manner in which soft drinks, beer, snack cakes, cookies, candy, and breakfast cereals are regularly repackaged to reflect particular holidays. Throughout the book, Santino examines the logic by which commercial culture and holidays are linked. This, in turn, has led to some interesting transmutations as one text borrows from another in the wake of a commercial success.
