Juni 1945. Weesow bei Werneuchen, vor den Toren von Berlin. In einem sowjetischen Internierungslager hat sich ein Häftling auf der Toilette erhängt. Karl Neumann, NSDAP-Mitglied seit 1930, war im Dritten Reich der Mann, der Walt Disney Konkurrenz machen und als Betriebsführer der Deutschen Zeichenfilm GmbH eine Trickfilm-Produktion nach amerikanischem Muster aufbauen sollte: keine animierten Propagandafilme, sondern bunte, völlig harmlose Tierfabeln für die ganze Familie. Hitler und Goebbels waren nämlich erklärte Fans disney-animierter Wald-und-Wiesen-Romantik à la SCHNEEWITTCHEN UND DIE SIEBEN ZWERGE - und Goebbels war der Meinung: Was die Amerikaner können, können wir Deutschen ebenso gut oder noch besser.

In "Bienenstich und Hakenkreuz" schildert Dr. Rolf Giesen anhand einer Vielzahl von Interviews mit Zeitzeugen die abenteuerlichen Irrwege des deutschen Trickfilms zur Zeit des Nationalsozialismus: Der Bombenangriffe auf Berlin wegen lagerte Neumann 1944 einen Teil der Produktion nach Dachau aus, in ein Künstlerheim, nicht weit entfernt vom Konzentrationslager - dort wurden Menschen gequält und vernichtet, hier triumphierte der Edelkitsch um entflozene Kanarienvögel und schniefende Hundewelpen. Millionen wurden in das Projekt gesteckt. Heraus kam nicht viel mehr als heiße Luft. Nur ein Kurzfilm wurde bis Kriegsende fertiggestellt: ARMER HANSI, ein weiterer in Dachau begonnen und nach dem Krieg von der DEFA übernommen: PURZELBAUM INS LEBEN - aber das von Goebbels großspurig initiierte Unternehmen wirkt im deutschen Animationsfilm bis heute nach...

The Neurobiology of Olfaction - Anna Menini 2009-11-24

Comprehensive Overview of Advances in Olfaction The common belief is that human smell perception is much reduced compared with other mammals, so that whatever abilities are uncovered and investigated in animal research would have little significance for humans. However, new evidence from a variety of sources indicates this traditional view is likely overly simplistic. The Neurobiology of Olfaction provides a thorough analysis of the state-of-the-science in olfactory knowledge and research, reflecting the growing interest in the field. Authors from some of the most respected laboratories in the world explore various aspects of olfaction, including genetics, behavior, olfactory systems, odorant receptors, odor coding, and cortical activity. Until recently, almost all animal research in olfaction was carried out on orthonasal olfaction (inhalation). It is only in recent years, especially in human flavor research, that evidence has begun to be obtained regarding the importance of retronasal olfaction (exhalation). These studies are beginning to demonstrate that retronasal smell plays a large role to play in human behavior. Highlighting common principles among various species - including humans, insects, *Xenopus laevis* (African frog), and *Caenorhabditis elegans* (nematodes) - this highly interdisciplinary book contains chapters about the most recent discoveries in odor coding from the olfactory epithelium to cortical centers. It also covers neurogenesis in the olfactory epithelium and olfactory bulb. Each subject-specific chapter is written by a top researcher in the field and provides an extensive list of reviews and original articles for students and scientists interested in further readings.

Sonic Interventions - Sylvia Mieszkowski 2007

The case studies deal with political appropriations of music and sounds, they explore the poetic use of the sonic in novels and plays, they develop theoretical concepts out of sonic phenomena, and pertain to identity formation and the practice of mixing in hip hop, opera and dancehall sessions. Ultimately, the book brings to the fore what roles sound may play for the formation of gendered identity, for the stabilization or questioning of race as a social category, and the conception of place. Their intricate interventions beckon critical attention and offer rich material for cultural analysis.
