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**Das persönliche Überleben des Todes, Bd. 2** - Emil Mattiesen 2013-07

Seit Menschengedenken existiert die eine zentrale Frage: Was passiert mit uns nach dem Tode? Nicht nur in philosophischen Zusammenhängen, auch auf praktischer Ebene gelangen Forscher zu erstaunlichen Ergebnissen. Emil Mattiesen ist einer der wichtigsten Vertreter der deutschen Parapsychologieforschung. Sein dreibändiges Hauptwerk „Das persönliche Überleben des Todes“ gilt seit seinem Erscheinen 1936-39 als Standardwerk der Parapsychologie und hat bis heute nicht an Bedeutung verloren. Mattiesen nähert sich der Frage nach dem Weiterleben auf empirischer Basis: In seinem Hauptwerk belegt er seine Theorien mit faszinierenden Berichten aus Séancen, von Medien und Augenzeugen parapsychologischer Phänomene. Seine Beweise für ein Leben nach dem Tod konnten bislang nicht widerlegt werden. Mattiesens Studien sind grundlegend und insbesondere der Umfang seiner Untersuchungen genießt noch heute in der Forschung hohe Anerkennung. 'Ängste und Sorgen, Befürchtungen und Hoffnungen, Liebe und Haß, namentlich aber die Aufregungen eines katastrophalen Todes, welche noch in das im Sterben zutage tretende Unterbewußtsein hinüberzittern, werden von diesem in Form von Autosuggestionen mit hinübergenommen in den veränderten Zustand und suchen sich von dorthin noch materiell zu verwirklichen, wenn die neuen Lebensbedingungen das Ich schon nach einer ganz andern Richtung weisen.' *The Original Verses of Apollodorus' >Chronica<* - Kilian Fleischer 2020-07-20

The Chronica by the grammarian Apollodorus of Athens (2nd century BC) was an exemplary chronographical reference work. It was composed in trimeters and represents the first Iambic didactic poem ever. So far, the surviving original verses have hardly been appreciated and analyzed in their own terms. Therefore a comprehensive collection of these verses is provided, including an introduction, edition, translation and commentary. Most verses stem from Philodemus' Index Academicorum, a Herculanean papyrus. Through the use of new imaging techniques and cutting-edge editing methods, enormous textual progress has been made. Many verses have been newly restored or significantly improved. They often reveal new hard facts about Academic philosophers and also bear some relevance for the dating of the Chronica and for Apollodorus' biography. In short, this collection guarantees easy access to the genuine verses of the Chronica, as originally drafted by Apollodorus, and thereby facilitates a contextualization or comparison with other (Iambic) didactic poems on a dramatically changed textual basis. The scope of the book fulfills various scholarly desiderata from a historical, philosophical, philological and literary-critical standpoint.

Ranked by many scholars as the greatest master of early Italian Renaissance painting, Masaccio (1401-1428) was the first artist to use effects of light to create three-dimensional images on a two-dimensional plane. This achievement, revolutionary in Masaccio's day, is one of the painter's significant contributions to art history. This book explores Masaccio's accomplishment as epitomized by the multipaneled painting of which the Saint Andrew panel is thought to have once formed a part: the Pisa Altarpiece, one of the truly great polyptychs in the history of Italian Renaissance art, produced in 1426 for a chapel in the church of Santa Maria del Carmine, Pisa. The text discusses Masaccio's short life and illustrious career; the commission for the altarpiece; its patron and program; the painting's original location; and the role that the church friars played in the actual commission. Finally, after examining the polyptych's individual panels, the book traces their subsequent history and recounts how art historians came to identify them.

Königsberg, home to the greatest German philosopher, Immanuel Kant, is now Kaliningrad, Russia; Strasbourg, in whose cathedral Wolfgang von Goethe, Germany's greatest writer, discovered the distinctiveness of his country's art and history, now lies within the borders of France. For most of the five hundred years covered by this book Germany has been composed of many separate political units, each with a distinct history. And any comfortable national story Germans might have told themselves before 1914 was destroyed by the events of the following thirty years. MacGregor chooses objects and ideas, people and places that still resonate in the new Germany—porcelain from Dresden and rubble from its ruins, Bauhaus design and the German sausage, the crown of Charlemagne and the gates of Buchenwald—to show us something of its collective imagination. Photography does more than simply represent the world. It acts in the world, connecting people to form relationships and shaping relationships to create communities. In this beautiful book, Margaret Olin explores photography's ability to "touch" us through a series of essays that shed new light on photography's role in the world. Olin investigates the publication of photographs in mass media and literature, the hanging of exhibitions, the posting of photocopied photographs of lost loved ones in public spaces, and the intense photographic activity of tourists at their destinations. She moves from intimate relationships between viewers and photographs to interactions around larger communities, analyzing how photography affects the way people handle cataclysmic events like 9/11. Greek Texts and Armenian Traditions - Francesca Gazzano 2016-08-22

An interdisciplinary approach, crucial as it is in most fields of research, proves itself to be unescapable in the study of interactions between the ancient Armenian and Greek worlds and literatures. The volume arises from such an awareness and collects papers presented in a conference which has been organized in 2013 at the University of Genova, thanks to a cooperation with the Université Paris-Sorbonne, following in the footsteps of a tradition inaugurated by Giancarlo Bolognesi in the years

'80 and '90. The subject is explored from many points of view: the topic of Armenian translations of Greek texts - with considerations of a methodological nature and the discussion of case-studies -, aspects which pertain to the historical context and the historiographical sources, the wide theme of the Armenian reception of Biblical, Christian and Byzantine literature, and finally philological, linguistic and lexical problems. The aim of this kind of research is to exploit the cooperation among classical philologists, linguists and Armenologists, in order to face the challenge of investigating a subject which requires many different competences.
